Pupil Premium Statement

2019 - 2020 REVIEW

The pupil premium grant is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of pupils who receive or have received in the past, free school meals. This money is designed to help disadvantaged pupils of all abilities perform better and have access to learning opportunities in order for them to perform better and close the gap between them and their peers.

Pupil premium funding is available to both mainstream and non-mainstream schools, such as special schools and pupil referral units. It is paid to schools according to the number of pupils who have been:

- registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years
- been in care for 6 months or longer

Schools receive

- £1320 for each eligible primary-aged pupil
- £2300 for pupils who are in care or children who have been adopted from care or left under a special guardianship or residence order.

School are free to spend pupil premium money as they see fit but are required to publish how this additional funding has been used to support pupils of low income families.

It is the responsibility of the governors to explain pupil premium expenditure to parents in the form of an annual statement.

This report aims to detail information on how the Pupil Premium Grant will be used within school.

2019 – 2020

During this academic year it is anticipated that 10 pupils will receive either Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) or Pupil Premium Grant+ (PPG+) totalling an income of £14,180.

Summary of the in-school barriers to educational achievement faced by some of the eligible pupils at Sabden:

- 1. Limited extended opportunities outside of school hours, including cultural and educational visits and activities
- 2. Lower attendance and/ or punctuality
- 3. Limited parental engagement impacting upon regular completion of homework and consolidation of learning activities linked to reading and basic skills
- 4. Lower attainment in Reading, Writing and Maths

How the Pupil Premium Grant will be spent in 2019 – 2020:

Barrier	Expected Outcome	Provision

1. Limited extended opportunities outside of school hours, including cultural and educational visits and activities

PPG pupils to have access to extended opportunities outside of school such as local sporting clubs and groups and priority access to arranged theatre trips and other cultural visits.

Identified pupils will be targeted and funded to attend groups and clubs outside of school.

Identified pupils will be given priority for school-led after school enrichment clubs, taking into account their interests.

Identified pupils will be offered priority places on trips and experiences as part of the extended curriculum.

Identified pupils will be subsidised for all school trips including residential activities.

PPG money set aside: £3,000 ACTUAL SPEND: £1088

2. Lower attendance and/ or punctuality for some PPG pupils

PPG pupils are in school, regularly and consistently.

PPG pupils with poor attendance will have weekly 1:1 catch-ups with nominated staff member

Personalised rewards system to celebrate attendance and punctuality

Free/ subsidised Before and After School Club places offered

High risk pupils will have an individual action plan

Identified pupils will have parental contracts put in place

Involvement of PAST where progress is not made

Involvement of school nurse to advise regarding medical issues

CAF/ TAF meetings as appropriate

'Late Gate' days to improve punctuality

Race to School celebrations and prizes.

100% attendance prizes at end of year.

4.Lower attainment in Reading, Writing and Maths

Identified pupils will achieve at least the expected level of progress from their starting point and the attainment gap will lessen between PPG and non-PPG pupils. 1:1 tutoring for identified PPG pupils as appropriate

Small group intervention to fill gaps, practise and consolidate learning, explore new skills and knowledge

Additional in-class support to aid quality first teaching Progress and attainment tracked half termly with PPG pupil meetings

Priority readers heard at least 3 times weekly 1:1

Lunchtime club with sole use of tablets, laptops, computers for PPG pupils

REVIEW JULY 2020:

THE ACTUAL TOTAL FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2019/ 20 WAS £17,485. THREE PPG PUPILS WERE ADMITTED TO SCHOOL IN JANUARY 2020. THE TOTAL NUMBER OF CHILDREN IN RECEIPT OF PPG FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 19/20 WAS 14, WITH 11 PUPILS CURRENTLY IN RECEIPT OF FREE SCHOOL MEALS.

THE TOTAL INCOME FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR FOR PPG PUPILS WAS £17,485

THE TOTAL SPENDITURE IS £17860.50
