### Pupil Premium Statement

#### April 2020 – March 2021 REVIEW

The pupil premium grant is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of pupils who receive or have received in the past, free school meals. This money is designed to help disadvantaged pupils of all abilities perform better and have access to learning opportunities in order for them to perform better and close the gap between them and their peers.

Pupil premium funding is available to both mainstream and non-mainstream schools, such as special schools and pupil referral units. It is paid to schools according to the number of pupils who have been:

- registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years
- been in care for 6 months or longer

Schools receive

- £1345 for each eligible primary-aged pupil (increase of £20 from 19/20)
- £2345 for pupils who are in care or children who have been adopted from care or left under a special guardianship or residence order (increase of £45 from 19/20).

Schools are free to spend pupil premium money as they see fit but are required to publish how this additional funding has been used to support pupils of low income families.

It is the responsibility of the governors to explain pupil premium expenditure to parents in the form of an annual statement.

This report aims to detail information on how the Pupil Premium Grant will be used within school.

#### 2020 – 2021

During this financial year it is anticipated that 16 pupils will receive either Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) or Pupil Premium Grant+ (PPG+) totalling an income of £26,730.

Review: The financial year's outturn statement showed this figure to be £23,340.

Summary of the barriers to educational achievement faced by some of the eligible pupils at Sabden during COVID 19 (online learning):

1. Lack of access to quality digital devices for learning at home.
2. Lack of reading books/ material at home.
3. PPG pupils learning at home do not have access to high quality, engaging and challenging learning materials and resources.
4. PPG pupils have had few opportunities to socialise with other children throughout national lockdown, impacting upon mental health and wellbeing

How the Pupil Premium Grant will be spent in 2020 – 2021:

REVIEW April 2021: School bought 1 ipad for a PPG pupil. 10 reconditioned laptops were donated to school. 4 ipads were received from the DfE. In total 6 PPG pupils required a digital device (60%).		
2. Lack of reading books/ material at home	All PPG children will have access to quality reading books, including phonics books.  PPG pupils will continue to read and develop skills using high quality reading material.	PPG pupils will have access to Oxford Reading Tree Online Library
PPG money set aside: £1500 ACTUAL SPEND = £1130		
REVIEW April 2021:  School purchased an online library of books that PPG pupils could access at home. PPG pupils were heard read by their teacher via zoom reading sessions. Staff monitored pupil access to the online library. Reading progress did not decline over the lockdown with pupils returning to school having made good progress.  Oxford Reading Tree online library £630 Phonics books Online £500 PhonicsPlay (free)		
3. Pupils learning at home do not have access to high quality, engaging and challenging learning materials and resources.	PPG pupils will be motivated and encouraged to participate in online learning.  PPG pupils will continue learning at home and developing and consolidating skills.	Staff will purchase high quality, high interesting resources that can be shared through online learning and other learning at home.

High quality resources were purchased and used to encourage and enhance online learning. A parental questionnaire undertaken in March 21 after remote learning showed:  
75% of PPG enjoyed remote learning (25%, 1 child, did not enjoy remote learning as they preferred to be in school.)  
100% of PPG enjoyed the live teaching sessions.  
100% of PPG believed stated that enough work was uploaded, taught etc during the remote learning period.

4. PPG pupils have had few opportunities to socialise with other children throughout national lockdown

PPG will enrol onto the summer club programme and engage in social, creative and fun activities, boosting mental health.

PPG will be offered free places at all after school enrichment clubs provided by school in order to boost confidence and take part in activities with peers.

PPG pupils will attend Breakfast and/ or After School provision in order to increase opportunities for social interaction and a positive start to the school day.

PPG pupils will be supported by the school's mental health lead through Edward the Bear Club and/ or bespoke mental health sessions.

PPG will be offered free provision at the school's Summer Club (£13 per day x 8 x 9) = £936

REVIEW April 2021:

Higher PPG uptake of clubs was noticed in relation to previous years.

April 2021 - Extra Teaching Assistant Level 3 support was made available across the year groups for PPG pupils. This included specific short and longer term intervention support to close gaps, in class support, organising resources etc.
